About Us – TUM Team (Task 1.2)

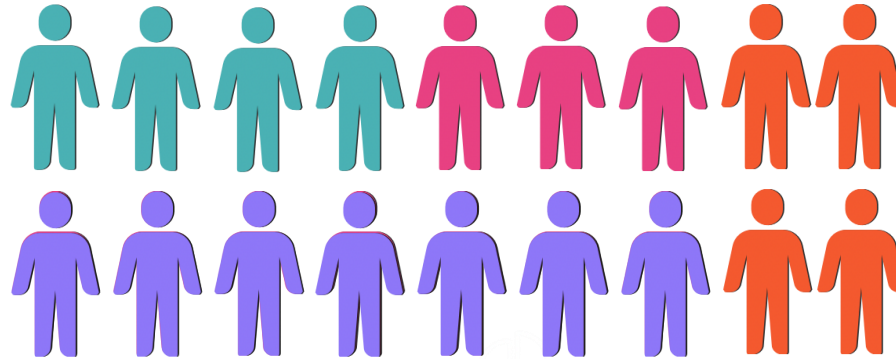
Goals:

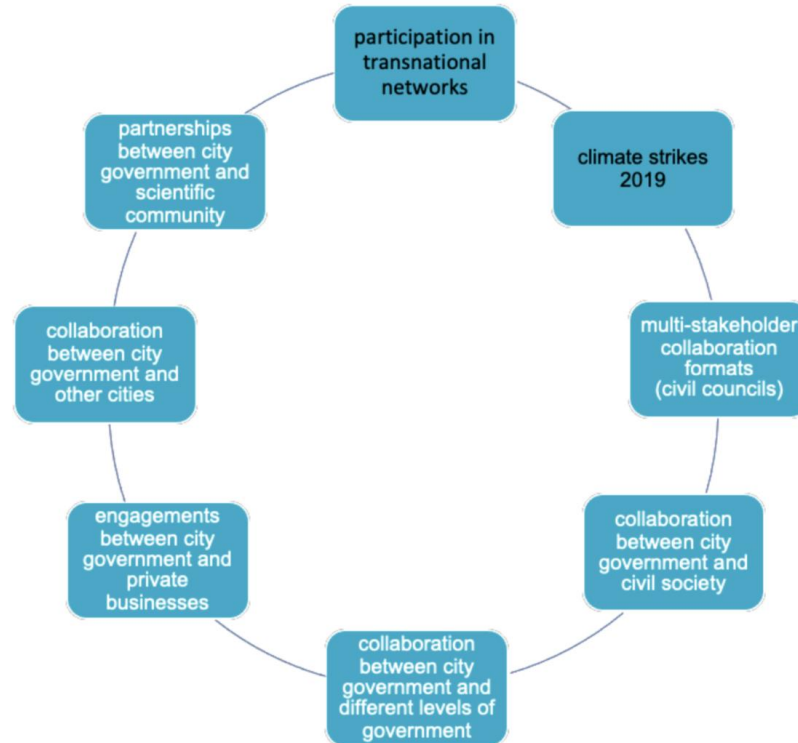

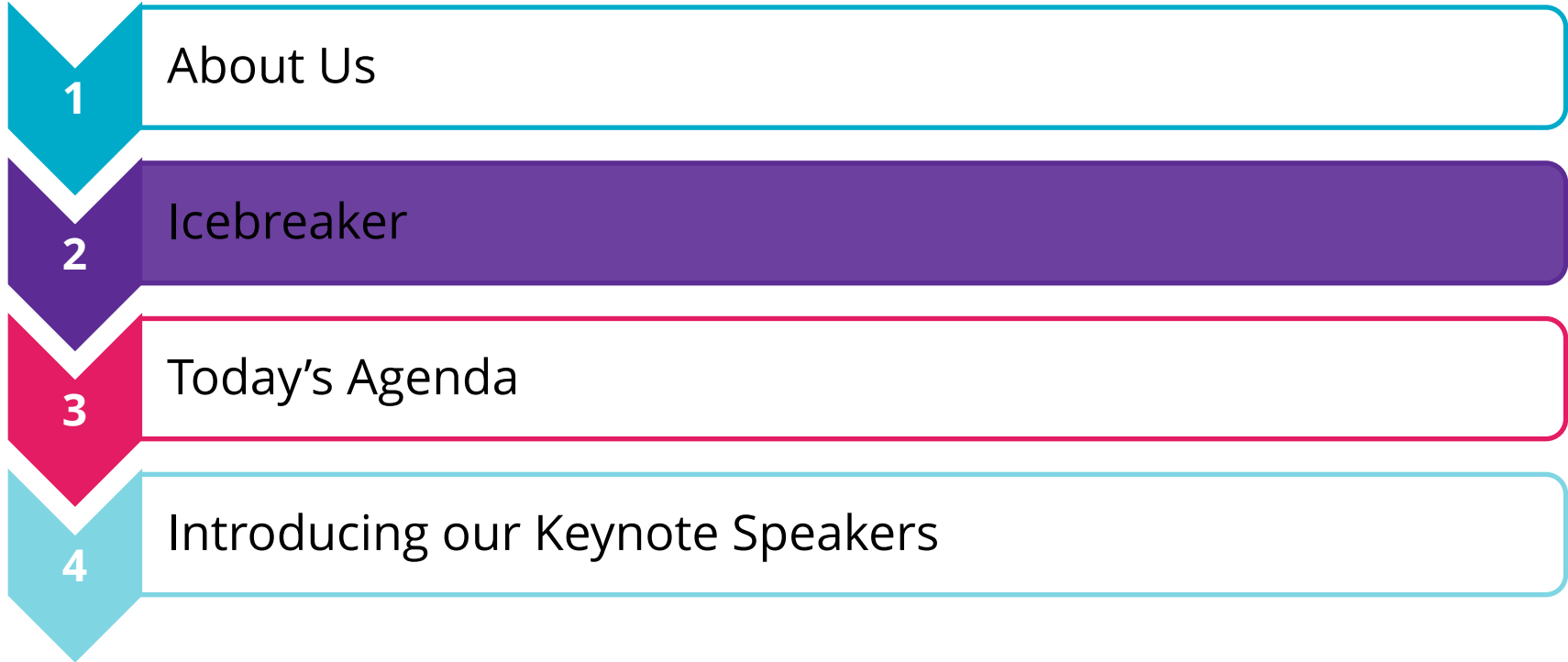
Task 1.4 Goals

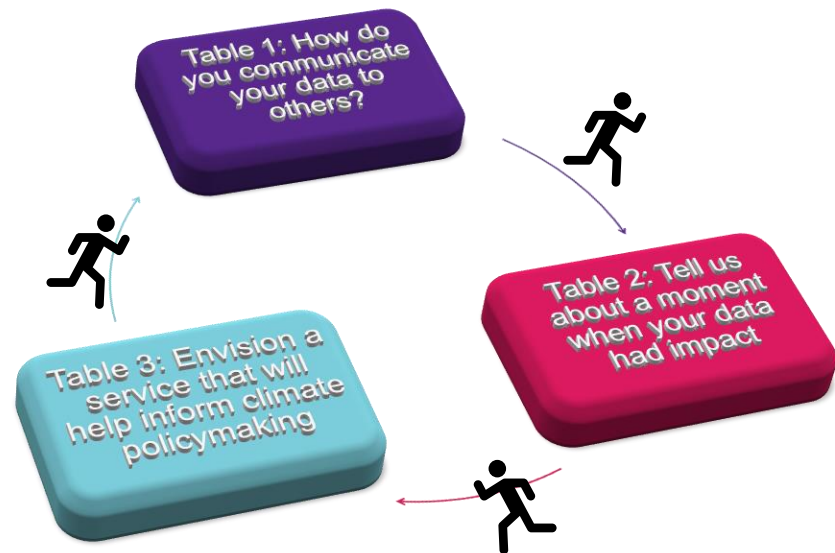
